Content: thematic propositions

- **Proposition 1**: Fostering entrepreneurship through university education and training increase youth intentions to engage in entrepreneurship?
- **Proposition 2**: Does locus of control and need for achievement influence youth intentions to engage in venture creation?
- **Proposition 3**: Big Five personality traits do have a significant impact on the attitude towards risk, especially on the dimension that concerns the inclination for profits or security?
